# Biden, Xi up promises, climate, Covid rule UN

Governments globally face mounting costs from extreme weather events

JOE BIDEN AND Xi Jinping boosted their efforts to help other nations address climate change as fears over the global environment and the Covid-19 pandemic dominated the first day of world leaders addressing the annual United Nations General Assembly.

President Biden said in his speech Tuesday morning that the US would double funding to aid developing countries cope with climate change, helping bring the world closer to a \$100 billion annual target sought ahead of a climate conference in Scotland next month.

"Making these ambitious investments isn't just good climate policy, it's a chance for each of our countries to invest in ourselves and our own future," Biden said. Hours later in a pre-recorded video, Xi said China will stop building coal-fired power plants abroad, a move long sought by climate activists.

"China will step up support for other developing countries in developing green and low-carbon energy and will not build new coal-fired power projects abroad," Xi said.

It was unclear if that meant China would stop all involvement with coal-fired power plants, including providing fi-

nancing. At a briefing in Beijing on Wednesday, Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian said he would try to learn more from relevant departments about the details of Xi's plan.

The moves by leaders of the world's two biggest economies signalled the importance placed on climate change as governments globally face mounting costs from extreme weather events.

Continuing the focus on climate, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said he'll submit the Paris climate accord to his nation's parliament for approval, while the president of the Maldives, Ibrahim Mohamed Solih, said rising global temperatures would be a "death sentence" for his island nation.

UN secretary-general Antonio Guterres praised the announcements by Biden and Xi Tuesday but said in a statement that "we still have a long way to go" to ensure the conference

next month "marks a turning point in our collective efforts to address the climate crisis."

Sounding a bleak tone for the gathering, Guterres warned in remarks earlier Tuesday that the world is hurtling toward ecological destruction and that the "climate alarm bells" are "ringing at fever pitch." Calling current global efforts insufficient, he forecast a "hellscape of temperature rises" if emissions aren't cut more than currently planned. "We are weeks away from the UN Climate Conference in Glasgow, but seemingly light-years away from reaching our targets," Guterres said. "We must get serious. And we must act fast."

Global leaders are in New York this week against the backdrop of a world that's increasingly fracturing into polarized camps.

Repeating vows to work more collaboratively with allies and global institutions, Biden urged the world to turn from conflict toward cooperation.

While that message is meant to contrast with former President Donald Trump's "America First" approach to the world, Biden found himself trying to assuage frayed nerves among key allies.

Some foreign leaders were upset over the hasty withdrawal of American troops from Afghanistan. French officials also remain outraged over a new defense alliance that calls for the US and UK to provide nuclear-powered submarines to Australia.—BLOOMBERG

# Biden vows 'relentless diplomacy' to sceptical allies

PRESIDENT JOE BIDEN summoned the world's nations to forcefully address the festering global issues of the Covid-19 pandemic, climate change and human rights abuses in his first address before the UN General Assembly. He decried military conflict and insisted the US is not seeking "a new Cold War" with China.

But while stressing to fellow world leaders the urgency of working together, Biden avoided addressing criticism from allies about the chaotic US withdrawal from Afghanistan and a diplomatic tempest with France. Instead, Biden used his address Tuesday before the annual gathering of world leaders to make his case that the US remains a reliable international partner following four years of President Donald Trump's "America first" foreign policy.

"We're opening a new era of

relentless diplomacy, of using the power of our development aid to invest in new ways of lifting people up around the world," Biden said.

The president offered an impassioned plea for cooperation, to friends and adversaries, arguing that overcoming a daunting list of crises "will hinge on our ability to recognise our com-

mon humanity."

Biden said the US, under his watch, had reached a turning point with the end of military operations in Afghanistan last month, closing out America's longest war. That set the table, he said, for his administration to shift its attention to intensive diplomacy at a moment with no shortage of crises facing the

# Beyond Evergrande's troubles, a slowing Chinese economy

GLOBAL MARKETS HAVE watched anxiously as a huge and deeply indebted Chinese property company flirts with default, fearing that any collapse could ripple through the international financial system.

China Evergrande Group, the developer, on Wednesday said it reached a deal that might give it some breathing room in the face of a bond payment due the next day. But that murky arrangement doesn't address the broader threat for Beijing's top leaders and the global economic outlook: China's growth is slowing, and the government may

have to work harder to rekindle it. Retail sales were much more weak than expected last month in China, led by slower car sales. Industrial production has slackened, particularly for large freight trucks. And developers sharply reduced new housing projects over the summer, while rushing to finish the projects they had already started.

Heavy government spending on new rail lines, highways and other projects is keeping the economy afloat right now, but may not be sustainable through next year. Markets have been riveted by the idea that Evergrande

could be China's "Lehman moment," a reference to the collapse of the Lehman Brothers investment bank back in 2008 that kicked off the global financial crisis. While many economists in China are pouring cold water over the idea of potential financial contagion, they are pointing to the broad weakness in China's property market, a mainstay of the economy, and other long-term threats. "This is not a Lehman moment. This is too sensational," said Xu Sitao, an economist in the Beijing office of Deloitte. "The question is next year." —NYT

globe. "Today, many of our greatest concerns cannot be solved or even addressed by the force of arms," he said. "Bombs and bullets cannot defend against Covid-19 or its future variants." Biden offered a robust endorsement of the UN's relevance and ambition at a difficult time in history, and sought to reassure wary allies of US cooperation.

He pledged to double US financial aid to poorer countries to help them switch to cleaner energy and cope with the "merciless" effects of climate change. That would mean increasing assistance to about \$11.4 billion a year. This after five months ago doubling the amount to \$5.7 billion a year.

As part of the fight against climate change, rich nations for many years have promised to spend \$100 billion a year in climate help, but a new study shows that they're \$20 billion a year short. Biden said his new commitment would help rich nations reach their goal.

In climate negotiations there's a dramatic rich-poor nation gap. Developing nations and others are reluctant to curb emissions further of heat-trapping gases without help from developed nations, which — in the words of British Prime Minister Boris Johnson — are "the guys that created the problem."

Biden seemed to look past the mounting skepticism he's faced from world leaders in the early going of his presidency, including criticism that Biden has given too little weight to allies' concerns on issues that have ramifications for America's friends on the world stage.

Eight months into his presidency, Biden has been out of sync with allies on the ending to the US war in Afghanistan. He has faced differences over how to go about sharing coronavirus vaccines with the developing world and over pandemic travel restrictions. And there are questions about the best way to respond to military and economic moves by China.

# 'We need to draw on shared lessons to change narrative on gender parity'

PRESIDENT OF THE 76th session of the UN General Assembly Abdulla Shahid has underlined the need to draw on shared lessons to change the narrative on gender parity, telling women leaders he hopes the current UNGA session will be gender-sensitive and champion policies that empower women and girls.

Shahid held a special meeting here with female Heads of State and Government, and the European Commission, on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly's high-level week that commenced on Tuesday. "Gender equality is a topic that is close to my heart. As long as women and girls are denied their oppor-

tunity and rights, I will continue to advocate on this policy," Shahid said. The meeting was attended by President of Estonia Kersti Kaljulaid, President of the Republic of Moldova Maia Sandu, Tanzania's President Samia Suluhu Hassan, President of the European Commission Ursula von der Leyen, Bangladesh PM Sheikh Hasina and PM of Barbados Mia Amor Mottley.

"I will count on your support and views in going forward. We need to draw on shared lessons to change the narrative on gender parity - to renew our commitments as a show of faith that we will continue to fight for all women and girls," she said. PTI
